#### **Sophie Daniels**




Sophie Daniels is a Professional (usually non-performing), Songwriter and Head of Songwriting at The Institute of Contemporary Music Performance, (ICMP) where she pioneered Songwriting Provision in 2004. She is also a wife and mother to three children, Liberty, Cosmo and Rocco. Liberty died in 2011 and inspired the not for profit EP project 'Liberty's Mother'.

Liberty's Mother came about instinctively, after Sophie was invited to sing at a ceremony for MPs who had lost babies, which took place during Baby Loss Awareness Week 2018. Sophie was asked to perform her original song 'I Can Love You From Here', which was written by Sophie just ten weeks after her own baby daughter, Liberty, was stillborn at full term in 2011. The song had not been planned for sharing as part of her professional career, however, the reaction that followed that performance from MPs, charities and health professionals alike, convinced Sophie to record the song in Nashville and, ultimately, to turn it into a not for profit EP project about her experiences as a Mother who has lost her baby.

Asma Khalil is a consultant obstetrician at St George's Hospital and Professor at St George's Medical School, University of London. She is a subspecialist in Maternal and Fetal Medicine. She gained her MD(Res) at the University of London in 2009. She also has a Masters degree in Epidemiology from the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine and an MRC scholarship.

She has published more than 170 peer reviewed papers, and many published review articles and chapters. She was awarded many research prizes, both at national and international meetings. Her research interests include multiple pregnancy, hypertensive disease in pregnancy and fetal growth restriction. She is committed to the implementation of clinical guidelines in practice and believes that they could reduce inequalities in care across the NHS. She is an Expert Advisor to NICE and co-chaired the South West Maternity Network. She also chaired the Steering Committee of the Maternity Engagement Project to improve the outcomes of multiple pregnancies by implementing NICE quality standards. She is a member of the national fetal medicine Clinical Study Group.
