Every day in the UK, 14 babies are stillborn or die shortly after birth.

Sands is the leading stillbirth and neonatal death charity and exists to reduce the number of babies dying and to support anyone affected by the death of a baby, before, during or shortly after birth.



Sands provides bereavement support services both nationally through its Freephone helpline, mobile app, online community and resources, as well as locally through a network of around 100 regional support groups based across the UK and run by trained befrienders.



Sands works in partnership with professionals, trusts and health boards and offers a range of training programmes and bereavement care resources to ensure that every bereaved parent and family receives the best possible care wherever they are in the UK.



Sands promotes improvements in practice and supports research to better understand the causes of baby deaths and save babies' lives.

Sands raises awareness of baby loss and works with governments, key influencers and other stakeholders to make reducing the number of babies dying a priority nationally and locally.

Over the past 43 years, Sands has grown into a national charity with a powerful vision shared by dedicated volunteers, fundraisers, members, donors, healthcare professionals, partners, staff and bereaved parents and families.

Sands has grown its income by over 40% since 2012 and, as part of our strategic plan, is focusing on how we can make the biggest difference to the lives of bereaved families and save babies' lives. To find out more, visit www.sands.org.uk

Sands Staff Benefits

Annual Leave

Staff receive 28 days annual leave per annum pro rata, plus bank holidays. Staff will be required to take 3 days annual leave during the period between Christmas & New Year.

About the role

Sands is the leading stillbirth and neonatal death charity and exists to reduce the number of babies dying and to support anyone affected by the death of a baby, before, during or shortly after birth.

We are looking to recruit an experienced bereavement professional to coordinate Sands' support services in Scotland, supporting bereaved parents and the health care professionals caring for them. This is a key role which will help us to promote Sands' vision; a world where fewer babies die and when a baby dies those affected receive the best care and support for as long as they need.

There are 174 babies stillborn annually in Scotland, which is 4 stillbirths every week; this is better than the UK average but there is variation across the country. 110 babies also die neonatally in Scotland every year, which means 6 babies die in Scotland every week.

In this vital role you will be responsible for ensuring the quality and distribution of Sands' bereavement support services and resources across Scotland working with our groups across the country and developing new channels of support.

Sands Scotland Volunteer Befrienders provide vital peer support to bereaved families across the country and your role will be to ensure that:

- Sands reaches as many and as diverse a range of bereaved families as possible
- Befrienders receive the training, support and resources needed to provide these services
- An ongoing recruitment programme to ensure that services are sustainable and effective
- New support groups are developed in areas where needed

You will link with other bereavement support services across Scotland, including but not solely those associated with stillbirth and neo-natal death and ensure collaborative working wherever possible.

Excellent verbal and written communication skills are essential, as you will need to engage with a wide range of internal and external stakeholders.

You will need to demonstrate a high level of commitment to safeguarding, strength-based practice and equality as well as awareness of grief theory and recovery models.

Main Purpose of Job:

Responsible for the quality, development and delivery of Sands bereavement support services in Scotland.

Work within Sands' Bereavement Support Services Team to ensure Sands Scotland Befrienders are recruited, trained and supported in their roles, delivering support through a variety of channels.

Work with Sands Scotland befrienders and support groups to encourage and develop support offerings appropriate to the resources and demands of an area.

Work with the National Bereavement Care Pathway (NBCP) Lead and Hospital Liaison Volunteers in Scotland to ensure integrated support for families leaving hospital.

To be responsible for the continuing development of Sands bereavement support services working collaboratively and imaginatively to address country-specific challenges and opportunities.

Engage on Sands behalf with other organisations providing support in Scotland, to encourage best practice and improved support for parents and others.

Principal tasks and responsibilities

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Growing and sustaining a network of motivated and dynamic Sands peer support volunteers before, during or shortly after birth
- Working with Sands Scotland Support Groups and befrienders to enhance and grow their face to face and digital bereavement support, to ensure we reach as many bereaved parents experiencing stillbirth and neo-natal death, as possible
- Identifying and developing opportunities to enhance the bereavement support offer in Scotland
- Supporting volunteers to be the parent voice in relevant Bereavement Networks and meetings
- Ensure that Sands digital bereavement support in Scotland is of a high quality, reflects Sands' values and provides timely support to a diverse range of bereaved parents
- Work with the BSS team and Sands' Training Team, to ensure Sands' training offer to Befrienders is up to date and evidence-based
- Input into development of resources for specific groups e.g. sibling support, higher risk groups
- Support and enhance the Safeguarding function with the BSS Team
- Build relationships with other baby loss support organisations across Scotland, to ensure parents have choice and that Sands works collaboratively alongside these providers where appropriate
- Undertake direct client contact as part of the telephone and email helpline service, undertaking around 3/4 shifts per month.
- Input into the development of Sands bereavement support and memory-making resources, with a focus on embracing digital and online support, as an integral part of the BSS team.
- Liaise with other organisations across Scotland ensuring Sands creates an offer that complements the picture of support for bereaved families
